Rules and Guidelines for Submissions:

- In an essay, describe what diversity and inclusion means, and why it is important to you.
- One entry per person. The essay must have a minimum of 250 words and not to exceed 500 words.
- Essay should be typed double spaced in font size 12 points and include the author's name, telephone number, email address, grade level and school name.
- Student must be in good standing with his/her school.
- Grades and attendance will also be considered, so please also submit a copy of your transcript.
- A letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, mentor or work place supervisor must be submitted along with your essay.
- Student must be a Maryland resident and must attend a Maryland school.
- Entries will be judged on originality, creativity and expression of ideas.
